



VICE-CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME

From donations received by the Annual Fund from alumni, staff and other friends, the University is offering the following scholarships.

At London South Bank University we understand how important a postgraduate degree is to career progression and professional fulfilment.

The Vice-Chancellor's Scholarship programme offers EU and international students three scholarships worth up to £8,000 each, creating opportunities for a variety of postgraduate students. The programme is made possible by donations to the University's Annual Fund from alumni and other supporters.

All EU or International students who have firmly accepted an unconditional or conditional offer to study on a postgraduate programme at LSBU are invited to apply for a scholarship. Their application will be assessed and, if successful, the student will receive an award. Only one application is allowed.

Award

Fee waiver, not exceeding £8,000 in total

Minimum selection criteria: A first-class honours in an undergraduate degree from any university (international equivalent) plus evidence of key academic, professional and practical achievements. Achievements should be at national or international level and demonstrate local impact, projects, volunteering and other civic engagement.

- We cannot consider your application if you have included incomplete or incorrect information, or have not included evidence of your degree classification.
- Applications received after the closing date will not be considered.
- Scholarship applications will only be accepted from those who have firmly accepted an offer (conditional or unconditional) of a place.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS –

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME 2017/18

Notes for Applicants:

1. Applicants must have accepted an unconditional or a conditional offer for 2017/18 on or before the deadline of 30 June 2017.
2. Only fully completed applications including requested documents will be considered by the panel. Incomplete applications will not be considered.
3. Scholarship applications must be received at LSBU by the given deadline.
4. The student must be classified as an Overseas Student or an EU Student (a national of an EU country except the UK), be self-funding and not in receipt of any other sponsorship and pay the required tuition fee deposit before 30 June 2017, if applicable.
5. Scholarships will be awarded by a scholarship panel on evidence of academic merit and previous practical or academic achievement.
6. All decisions by the scholarship panel are final. Scholarships will be given in the form of a fees reduction at enrolment, provided that the recipient produces the official certificate. If scholarship recipients do not enrol by 6 October 2017, the awards will be offered to runner ups.
7. Successful recipients of the Vice Chancellor's Scholarship are not eligible in the same academic year for any other scholarship or any discount on tuition fees.
8. We are unable to inform unsuccessful applicants. If feedback has not been received within 6 weeks of the deadline it can be assumed that the application has been unsuccessful.
9. Scholarships awarded for the academic period 2017/18 cannot be deferred to an alternative academic year and successful applicants are eligible for one scholarship only.
10. If at any stage in the process of assessing and awarding a scholarship, documents are found not to be genuine the application will be immediately withdrawn.
11. The programme must be a minimum of one year in duration, taught on campus, with a tuition fee of £7,500 or more.
12. Scholarship holders agree to assist in marketing activities for LSBU. Activities may include providing student testimonials and attendance at photo shoots for usage on the website, posters, external publications and mailshots, and attendance at recruitment events.
13. The University reserves the right to amend these terms and conditions if required.
