

Interview Guidance

Documents you must bring

When you attend an interview or application day, you will need to bring original proof of identity such as a current valid passport/Home Office documents. If you attend the interview without the original documents we may not be able to interview you and so will not be able to consider you for a place on the course.

The interview is the last part of the assessment procedure and is an opportunity to explain face -to-face why you are the right student for the course.

You will be asked a number of related questions to your chosen profession which will focus on realistic scenarios which health care professionals may need to manage within their working life.

Interview checklist:

- ✓ Dress smartly and appropriately for an interview
- ✓ Be clear, confident and convincing about your reasons for choosing this career
- ✓ Reflect on your personal qualities, skills and what you have learnt through any placement's or work experience with your answers
- ✓ Stay calm and collected; take your time to consider your answers

After interview:

If you have been successful at interview you will be asked to scan and email the following documents to our admissions team:

- Education certificates
- Birth certificate
- Photocopy of your passport
- Marriage certificate / Change of name authorisation (if applicable)
- Evidence of your current address on a utility bill, bank statement or council tax bill
- A completed declaration of character and conduct form
