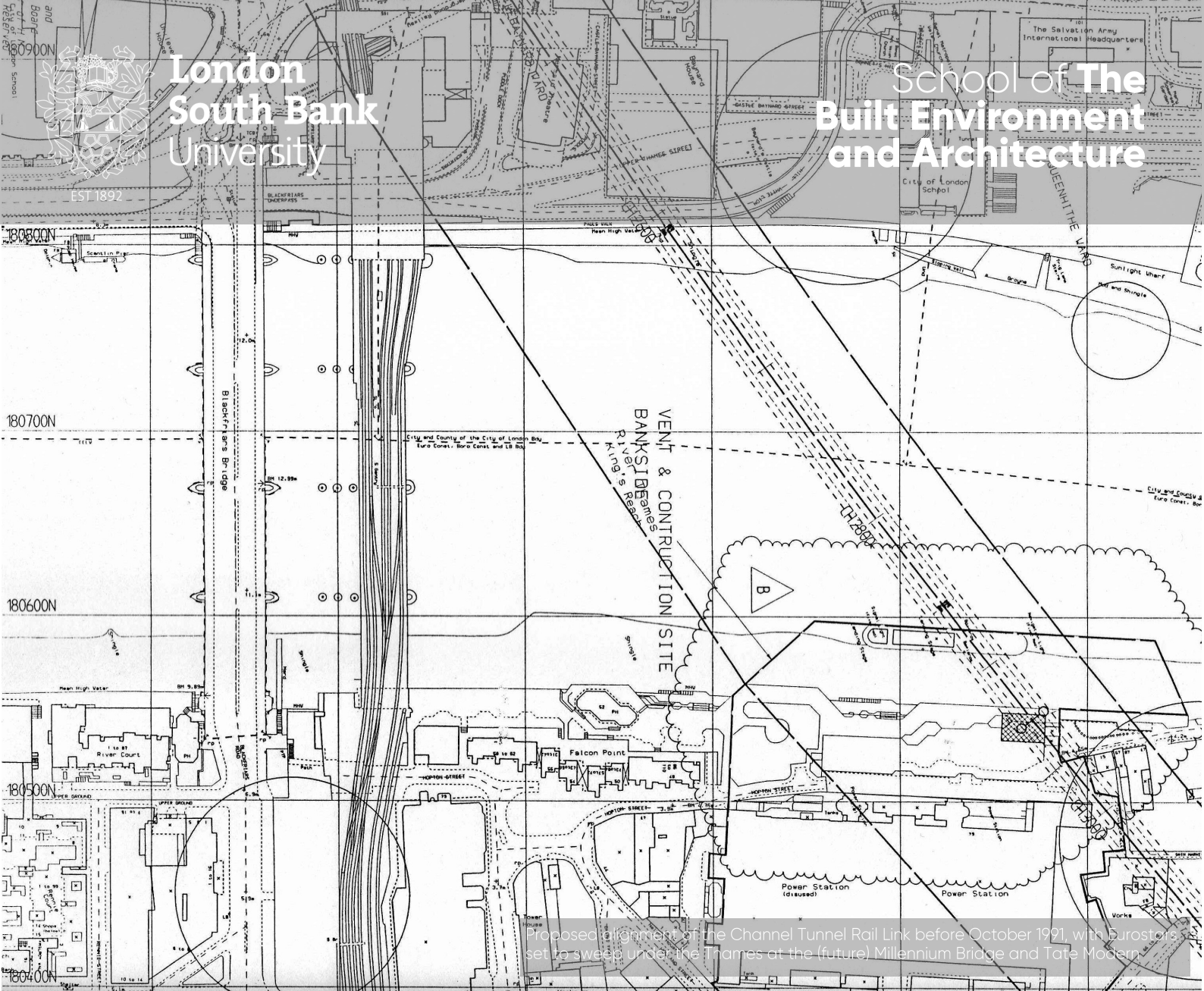
State-of-the-art research centre for biomedical scientists

The Francis Crick Institute is a biomedical research centre in London, which opened in 2016. The institute is a partnership between Cancer Research UK, Imperial College London, King's College London, the Medical Research Council, UCL and the Wellcome Trust.

Francis Crick (1916–2004) was the most renowned figure in biomedical history, created the first double-helix model of DNA and are the "fathers of modern genetics".

The £700m project was led by HOK Architects and AKT II as the structural engineers.
