




The LSBU Sustainability Team organised and delivered more than 20 events within a 2-week programme as part of bringing together *Go Green Week* and *Fairtrade Fortnight* related activities to raise awareness of these topics for both staff and students on sustainability.







This year, all kinds of games, competitions and other events were created and available for the LSBU community to make sustainability interesting and to keep them engaged.

Some of the highlights of *Sustainability Fortnight* 2017 are as follows

Palm Oil Game

To increase awareness about how palm oil used in everyday products (e.g. an ingredient in food) which directly results in deforestation in many locations around the world, habitat degradation for indigenous groups and displaces orang-utans which reside in these ecoystems.





Clothes Exchange

To increase awareness about how by swapping clothes can significantly reduce clothes being landfilled, the Sustainability Team held an on-going clothes exchange.

This took place each day by the *Sustainability Info*Desk — an opportunity to talk to staff members and students about the UN Sustainable Development Goals, as well as the events that were taking place during the *Fortnight*.
