












2. Newington Gardens

Southwark's dark history resonates in this park that housed the gaol and gallows for the whole borough in the 18th Century.

For further in formation on Newington's fascinating crim inal background, stop at the exit of the park to find the in formation board.

Trinity Church/Henry Wood Hall

A local church since 1800, this building now functions as a rehearsal hall and concert venue. Famously used by the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra.

This beautiful Georgian square has been chosen as a filmin a location for some fundamentally British favourites in cluding Bridget Jones' Diary, Sherlock and Luther.
