

Who are we?

What is widening participation?

Widening participation has been part of government education policy for decades. It was designed to address differences in progression to HE between different groups, acknowledging that learners from disadvantaged backgrounds may face significant barriers when considering, applying to, and succeeding in higher education.

At LSBU we work with anyone interested in further and higher education, however we provide extra programmes for those who come from under-represented social groups in HE and who might miss out on the opportunity to progress their education due to circumstances out of their control,

- learners receiving, or eligible for, free school meals
- disabled learners including those with long-term illness*
- adult learners anyone 21 or over who is interested in studying for an undergraduate degree
- care leavers and looked after children*
- young and adult carers*
- · learners with no parental/carer history of higher education
- refugees and asylum seekers
- Gypsy, Roma, Traveller, Showman and Boater communities*.

We are committed to challenging preconceptions, offering opportunities for learners and their families to explore new subjects and careers, and to using our network of academics, students, alumni and partners to support those considering further and higher education.

*Support for looked after children, young carers and other priority groups

Learners from these groups will get priority access to our activities, as well as bespoke support during application to LSBU such as one-to-one personal statement advice. Once enrolled at LSBU we provide additional support throughout your studies including bursaries, counselling and dedicated staff.



Data collection and GDPR

We collect data in several different ways depending on the activity,

- Online data collection forms completed by the participant before the activity takes place Year 9 and above.
- Online or paper data collection form completed by the parent/carer before the activity takes place – Year 8 and below.
- Online, paper or in-person feedback after the activity has taken place e.g. feedback forms, focus groups.
- Basic information supplied via secure platform/email from the school e.g. register.

Personal data is held securely on LSBU's CRM and digital engagement platforms which are used to collect the data through the online forms. There are a limited number of LSBU staff who have access to this data, all have received data protection training. Where data is not held on our servers, we use systems that are secure cloud based, and password protected. Workshop	Description
Why go to uni?	This session is an introduction to university. We will discuss the benefits of going to university and look at how certain careers require specific degrees. Learners will understand how going to university can benefit their careers and also their personal lives.
Choose your course	Supporting students to find the right course for them. The workshop looks at entry requirements, accreditation, work experience, career prospects and how to make the most of Open Days.

Workshop	Description
Degree apprenticeships	Introducing apprenticeships and the different types available. Looking at the reasons why it is a suitable pathway and how to apply for one. Touching on the differences between choosing to study at university or an apprenticeship.
Student finance	Covering the basics of student finance and busting any student finance myths. We offer students the most up-to-date information about how to apply for student finance, what students can expect from their student loan and how repayments work. We discuss additional funding that may be available to them such as grants and scholarships, and top tips for budgeting at university.
Budgeting	A workshop designed to help individuals understand the importance of budgeting – how to create a basic budget and how to make their money go further. We will share tips on how to save money as well as advice on how to supplement their budget as a student.
Personal statement support	A workshop for learners currently writing their UCAS Personal Statements. We look at how to structure a personal statement, content and what admissions tutors are looking for using examples so that learners can see how a personal statement comes together.
Mapping Mindsets	This session looks at the difference between limited mindset and growth mindset. Providing learners with tools that encourage a positive response to setbacks and challenges to help them reach their full potential and succeed at university.
Healthcare Courses Interview 101	This workshop is aimed at learners who have applied, or are considering applying, to healthcare courses that require interviews or a selection day as part of the application. Providing an overview of how the interviews are conducted, the types of questions and scenarios candidates can face and what the interviewers are looking for.



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

At LSBU we are educating and training students to support the community. Several of our degrees require students to undertake placements in a variety of settings from healthcare to education. BA (Hons) Social Work

Postgraduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) Primary

This course leads to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) and the award of a Postgraduate Certificate in Education. LSBU's Division of Education has a particular focus on social justice, inclusion and equality that is well matched to the needs of schools in urban and multicultural areas.

How does it work?

Trainee teachers are allocated a Professional Adviser and spend the first six weeks in the university learning about education theories, concepts, major developments, teaching styles, new technology, learning strategies, lesson planning, behaviour management, assessment for learning, subject knowledge, reflective practice, research skills, the Teachers' Standards and the National Curriculum. Trainee teachers deliver planned lessons to their peers and tutors before undertaking two school-based teaching practices in LSBU's Partnership primary schools:

- 1. Mid October to the end of January: An Initial Teaching Practice working towards 40% of the teaching responsibilities. Trainees start with an initial focus on early reading, phonics and mathematics; working with designated children to improve their English and mathematics. In December, trainees commence whole class teaching with a designated year group.
- 2. April to the beginning of July: A Final Teaching Practice working towards 80% of the teaching responsibilities with a designated year group.

Alternative Education Setting

In addition, trainee teachers undertake a placement in an alternative education setting for two weeks at the end of March to broaden their professional experiences and to appreciate education in different settings.

Partnership Primary Schools

The Education Division is always looking to establish new partnerships with primary schools. The Division currently supports three models of partnership working: Enhanced, Aided and Supported. The models reflect the level of support and funding provided to the schools from the Division for supporting PGCE trainees.

Reading Mentor Placement


Who?	Level 4 Undergraduate Students (first year)

When?	10 days across 5 weeks in February/March


Students must be supervised by a qualified member of staff at the setting. Students are responsible for undertaking all activity relevant to their assignments and do not require support from the setting supervisor other than ensuring they have the necessary experiences whilst on placement. A university Tutor will visit the student in the setting to ensure they are developing their skills and knowledge appropriately and to liaise with the setting supervisor.
