- 1. Please note that LSBU does not carry out any research on vertebrates or cephalopods. We do not conduct any research/experiment that would be regulated under the Animals in Scientific Procedures Act 1986, or the Animal Welfare Act 2006 and its amendments.
- 2. The only animal research LSBU carries out is always with non-protected species (non-cephalopod invertebrates) and is mainly observational; the types of projects using animals are very few. As such, we do not have plans to phase out this research as the nature and type of research as well as the species concerned do not raise any significant ethical or regulatory issues.
