#### **Student finance**

Could you be eligible to receive a scholarship or bursary to help pay for your course? We understand that paying for your course can be challenging, and we don't want it to be a barrier to your education. ### Full-time undergraduate study

At LSBU we've set our full-time fee for Home and EU undergraduates at £9,250 per year. You don't have to pay upfront for your course if you're a Home or EU student and you have a confirmed tuition fee loan from the Student Loans Company.

### Part-time undergraduate study

Home students on part-time courses are also entitled to apply for a tuition fee loan. And as long as it's your first degree – and you complete at least 25% of the full-time course in one year – you can apply for a student loan. Please note: if your loan isn't in place, you will need to pay at least the initial down payment at your face-to-face enrolment session. This will amount to half of your yearly tuition fees and will allow you to complete your enrolment. International students must consider all possible costs of studying in the UK. In addition to the course fees, you should also plan for accommodation, health, food, clothing, travel, and living costs.

## Student loans

You don't pay anything upfront if you are a full-time Home or EU student and have a confirmed tuition fee loan from the Student Loans Company.

Part-time students are eligible for tuition fee loans on exactly the same basis as full-time students (provided it's your first degree and you are studying at least 25% of a full-time course).

You start paying back your fees 3.5 years after your course starts – usually the April after you graduate – but only if you're earning enough.

If you study on a pre-registration health and social care undergraduate course, such as BSc Nursing, Midwifery or Radiography, you can apply for a tuition fee loan in the same way as for other undergraduate degrees.

## Visa and entry information

If English isn't your first language, you'll need to achieve a certain level before starting your course, through a recognised qualification. We accept a range of English language qualifications, details of which can be found online at [www.lsbu.ac.uk/international](http://www.lsbu.ac.uk/international) (all equivalent to IELTS6).

If you need a student visa to study in the UK, we advise you to check the Home Office immigration English language requirements. You may need to take a Secure English Language Test (SELT) as specified by the Home Office and meet the minimum component scores.

The main visa route for students who wish to study in the UK is the student visa. LSBU holds a sponsor licence. This means we can sponsor overseas students with the relevant qualifications to study here under the student visa category. Please note that student visa requirements may be subject to change at short notice. You should always consult the latest student visa policy guidance before making an application for entry clearance: [www.gov.uk/student-visa](http://www.gov.uk/student-visa).



## Types of courses that we teach

### International Undergraduate Foundation Programme

Open to international students, this one-year programme offers successful students progression to Year 1 in a wide range of undergraduate degrees at LSBU (subject to meeting entry criteria).

This is a great course to prepare you for academic study by introducing you to the study skills and research methods needed for a degree course.

### Accelerated degree

Our accelerated degrees condense the traditional three-year undergraduate course into two years, with the benefits of a academic support and student experience all year round. This can save you considerable cost on commute, accommodation and travel, and may be suitable if you want to apply for jobs after two years instead of three.

## Foundation course

A one-year foundation course can be a great way to prepare academically or explore a subject area before committing to a full degree course.

You can use the year as a pathway to degree-level studies, similar to an access course. You don't always need traditional academic qualifications to gain entry on these courses.

## Extended degree

Extended degrees are, essentially, a foundation year plus a degree course. You can complete the foundation year, choose from a range of degree courses, and complete a bachelor's degree.

Most extended degree courses take four years to complete full-time, but some may also be available part-time or allow you to work and study together (these can range from 3.5 years to 6 years part-time).

Extended degrees are currently available in these subject areas:

- **Built Environment**
- **Business Management**
- **Chiropractic**
- **Computer Science**
- **Nursing**
- **Occupational Therapy**
- **Physiotherapy**
- **Radiography**
- **Social Work**
- **Sport Rehabilitation**

## Integrated degree

Our integrated degrees offer a streamlined pathway to achieving two or more degrees.

You may start with a foundation year, add a placement or sandwich year into your undergraduate degree (placement year), and go straight onto a masters degree all in one. You'll need to check if these options are available on the course you're interested in on our website.

Typical examples of integrated degrees include:

- **MChiro Chiropractic**
- **MEng Engineering**
- **MSc Physiotherapy**
- **MSc Sport Rehabilitation**





## Pre-registration

These courses of study deliver the core skills and experience you'll need to pursue a career that requires its practitioners to register with a governing body, such as nursing, midwifery and radiography.

## Top-up courses

Top-up courses are usually a one-year course, suitable for those who have already achieved some university credit and wish to complete a bachelor-level degree. The level of study is typically equivalent to the third year of the degree course. You will need to provide your prior transcripts so we can confirm how much credit we can accept, and advise which modules you should take to complete a degree.



## How to apply

For full-time courses, please send your application through UCAS ([www.ucas.com](http://www.ucas.com)), the organisation responsible for managing applications to higher education courses in the UK. There are six key stages in the application process. You should make your application for part-time courses directly at [www.lsbu.ac.uk/apply](http://www.lsbu.ac.uk/apply).

International students need to apply by 19 November and can apply either through UCAS or directly to LSBU using the form on the international section of our website: [www.lsbu.ac.uk/international/how-to-apply](http://www.lsbu.ac.uk/international/how-to-apply).

Apply early! Popular courses could fill early in the cycle, so you have a better chance of obtaining a place on the course if you apply sooner. We give equal consideration to full-time applications received before the 15 January UCAS deadline.

Make sure you fill out your UCAS form correctly and thoroughly. The more information we have, the easier it is to make an informed decision without requesting further information. Make a note of the UCAS key dates and associated rules so you don't miss any important deadlines, eg when to accept your offer.

When applying you will be asked to submit a personal statement to tell us about your goals and what you want to do after you graduate. Think about what you want to learn on the course you have chosen, and how you would like to apply that to your future career. # 1.

## Choose your course

Refer to UCAS course search to see which universities offer the courses you're interested in:

- Make sure you check the full entry criteria on our website.
- Research the available options by looking at our website and prospectus, and by attending an Open Day.
- Contact our course enquiries team if you have any specific questions.



# 2.

## Apply

Visit the UCAS website for key application and deadline dates:

- Prepare your personal statement.
- Complete the qualifications section, listing all achieved and pending qualifications.
- Add your referee's details.
- Submit your application online via UCAS for full-time courses.
- Apply directly to LSBU for part-time courses.



## 3.

### The outcome of your application

- Universities aim to make decisions on all early applications by 31 March.
- You can track your application progress via UCAS.
- Some offers will be dependent on you attending an interview, which may include a test or submitting a portfolio. You will need to read all of the conditions attached to your offer carefully.
- Visit UCAS to reply to offers and make changes. Keep up with UCAS deadlines and your UCAS status.
- If you don't hold an offer after the first deadline date, you'll be eligible to apply for another course via UCAS Extra.

## 4.

### Waiting for examination results

Check the UCAS website for details of which qualifications are automatically sent to UCAS. If your qualification is not listed, you'll need to provide your results at [www.ucas.com/ucas/undergraduate/apply-and-track/results/sending-exam-results](http://www.ucas.com/ucas/undergraduate/apply-and-track/results/sending-exam-results). Once universities have your results, you'll be assigned one of the following UCAS statuses:

- You are accepted by your firm choice.
- You are accepted by your firm choice, but they make you an offer on an alternative course.
- Your results don't meet the conditions of your firm choice, but you are accepted by your insurance choice.
- Your results don't meet the conditions of any of your choices and you are eligible for Clearing.

# 5.

## Before you start your course

Once you have accepted your offer to LSBU and cleared any conditions, you'll be invited to enrol. You will be asked to register your place online and come in for a face-to-face enrolment. You'll also be invited to attend induction, which is usually specific to your course or department.

# Entry requirements

To be offered a place on one of our undergraduate courses, you'll need to demonstrate that you have the necessary skills to study. Our admissions officers look for evidence of your motivation and commitment, alongside aptitude and potential.

Each course has its own entry requirements, which are listed on the relevant course page on our website: [www.lsbu.ac.uk](http://www.lsbu.ac.uk). It's important that you read these before applying.

You'll need five GCSE passes at grade C or above – including English and Maths – for all courses. We also accept Functional Skills Level 2 Maths and English in place of GCSEs. If you completed your English and Maths GCSE under the new grading system, you'll need a grade 4 or higher.

If you are planning to study with us in September 2022 and are currently studying A-Levels or BTECS, you can use the table opposite to help calculate your points and compare with the entry requirements for our courses.


