

Erasmus policy statement

London South Bank University is committed to providing the Erasmus+ programme to its students and staff. We put a lot of effort into development of partnerships to enable mobility to take place and processes to ensure the smooth running of the programme. We have increased our numbers and developed stronger links with schools within the university.

It has always been the objective of the university to increase exposure of Erasmus+ to as many students and members of staff as possible in order to enhance individual development and build relationships with other universities overseas. It is also one of the goals of the university to develop the multicultural community of students and staff, to work through international alliances and partnerships to further build education, research and enterprise. The university strategy is to provide academic and internship opportunities overseas and develop international partnerships.

Staff mobilities enhance staff experience and play important role in personal development. Development of partnerships overseas is also in line with the University strategy to embed internationalisation within all schools. Members of staff participating in teaching mobilities contribute to development of these relationships. Many of these partnerships also develop further into TNE and other collaborative projects.

We will also continue to be publicly committed to enhancing the opportunities for students to include an international dimension to their degree and gain international experience, in order to compete in an increasingly global environment. Students going on Erasmus study mobility receive full academic recognition.

We will promote the programme and support the project, internationalisation and transnational education. It is included in the corporate plan and university strategy and Erasmus+ programme has the support of senior management and key academics in majority of subject areas.
