Section 40(2) – personal information	X	The term 'fewer than 6' is a standard practice in all FOI requests by the University when our counts relating to individuals are so low that they number fewer than 6 and there is likelihood that this could lead to a risk of individuals being identifiable. This should not be interpreted as the actual number being 6. We do this in order to prevent the personal data of the individuals that the response relates to from being indirectly disclosed.
		Personal data is defined in the DPA as "any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person." We consider that if we were to release the requested information, given the low count, there is a risk of the individuals being identifiable. In which case, this would contravene principle (a) relating to processing of personal data in Article 5 of the GDPR, specifically the fairness, transparency and purpose limitation principles.
