MATERIAL

Aerosols (Deodorant cans, cleaning sprays etc.)



PLEASE DO NOT PUT AEROSOLS INTO GENERAL WASTE BINS

Please place your empty aerosol cans into the new glass waste caddies in staff kitchens.

DISPOSAL

Aluminium cans

Recycling bins

Please make sure your aluminium cans are dry and empty before recycling.



Aluminium foil



Recycling bins

Please rinse if heavily soiled with food.

(Crisp packets, chocolate wrappers and cigarette wrappers are not aluminium foil. Please put these into general waste bins).



Batteries



PLEASE DO NOT PUT BATTERIES INTO GENERAL WASTE BINS

Please dispose of your batteries in the battery disposal tubes in the reception of each building. Batteries are classed as hazardous waste and must be dealt with separately.

Even better, change to rechargeable batteries as they are better for both the environment and your budgets in the long term!

Books, Hard Backed Directories, DVDs



Can your book/DVD be reused by someone else?

Take any unwanted books/directories/DVDs to either the bookswap shelves in the ground floor of the Student Centre or the book swap bin in the Perry Library entrance.

Cables (electrical)



DISPOSAL

PLEASE DO NOT PUT CABLES INTO GENERAL BINS

Cables and other electrical waste must legally be reused or recycled and treated as WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) waste.

Please contact the ICT Helpdesk for advice on how to dispose of this waste.





Recycling bins (if cardboard is small)

Please flatten bigger cardboard boxes and leave securely next to your nearest recycling bin.

Please do not leave in corridors as this constitutes a fire hazard.



Card boxes & Packaging (cereal boxes, tissue boxes etc.)




Recycling bins

Please ensure they are free from food and as flat as possible.



Cartridges (ink, toner, printer)

CDs, DVDs, VCRs, Tapes and **Minidisks**

There are currently no recycling facilities for this type of waste on campus.

Please place in the confidential waste bags provided which are periodically removed for recycling.

WASTE FACT #1: Waste oil from LSBU catering outlets is recycled by a local company into fuel.

DISPOSAL



Crisp packets and snack food wrappers



These cannot be recycled.


Electrical waste (e.g. kitchen equipment, torches, telephones etc.)



PLEASE DO NOT PUT ELECTRICAL WASTE INTO GENERAL BINS

Electrical waste must legally be reused or recycled and can be treated as WEEE (Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment) waste.

Please contact the ICT Helpdesk for advice as to how to dispose of this waste.





Recycling bins

Envelopes could be reused for internal mail.

Also see padded envelopes.



MATERIAL

First Aid waste



DISPOSAL

Please bag this and put it into the nearest clinical or sanitary

For large volumes please bag and take to Room J205 (J Block) in the School of Applied Sciences (ext. 7665 for information).





PLEASE DO NOT PUT FLUORESCENT TUBES INTO GENERAL BINS

Fluorescent tubes are classified as hazardous electrical waste. All tubes must be stored in special lamp containers (coffins).

If you have tubes/lamps to dispose of then please contact Estates Helpdesk (x6800).

Folders (box files, ring binders)



General waste or remove ring binders and recycle as metal

Please reuse wherever possible or can you offer these to your students?

Alternatively, please place them in the book swap bin in the Perry Library entrance.





Food packaging (food trays, wax-coated cardboard etc.)



General waste

Unless free from food particles. If rinsed and without contamination then these can be recycled.





Food tins (EMPTY)



Recycling bins

Please make sure your food tins are dry, clean and empty.



MATERIAL

General waste

No facilities are currently available for food recycling in either staff or student kitchens.



DISPOSAL

Food waste is segregated and collected from all commercial kitchens and outlets at LSBU main campus (this includes, plate and counter waste) and is turned into compost.

Furniture

Food waste



Can it be reused elsewhere in your department?

If you have furniture to dispose of then please contact the EAE Service Desk.



Glass bottles and jars



Student Centre – all glass can be recycled via The Venue

All other buildings – please leave in the glass caddies provided in kitchens and EAE will dispose of when full.

Please wrap any broken glass and place in the general waste bins.



Hand towels (white or green paper towels)

Hazardous wastes



All hazardous wastes require specialist disposal – please follow relevant guidance supplied by your Dept/School.





Junk Mail & Magazine inserts



You don't even have to take the plastic cover off but it helps if you do!

You can even help to stop excessive junk mail reaching your home address by registering with the Mailing Preference Service (www.mpsonline.org.uk/mpsr/).



Laminated Paper & Posters



General Waste - for large quantities

For small quantities (less than 5% of a bag) you can add these into the confidential waste paper bags. They are accepted by our contractor in small quantities if mixed with paper.



Light bulbs (filament or energy-saving)



PLEASE DO NOT PUT LIGHT BULBS INTO GENERAL BINS

If you have lamps to dispose of then please contact EAE Helpdesk on x6800 or estatesservices@lsbu.ac.uk.





MATERIAL

Metal (paperclips, cans) Recycling bins



Please reuse paperclips wherever possible.

WASTE FACT #3:

DISPOSAL

Crisp packets/sweet wrappers are non-recyclable and are usually not made of metal – please put into general waste.



Milk bottles (plastic)



Recycling bins

Please rinse bottles and remove the lid and recycle both.

Glass milk bottles should be returned to place of purchase or put into glass caddies in kitchens.



Mobile phones





PLEASE DO NOT PUT MOBILE PHONES INTO GENERAL BINS

If you have a mobile phone to dispose of please send them or drop them into the ICT Helpdesk in Borough Road (Room G70) ext. 6500.



Plastic (hard) (CD & DVD cases, pen barrels, lids etc.)





If the item contains a recycling triangle, please recycle (clean and dry) in the plastic recycling bins.


